

Fruit Pollination

Pollination of Apple Trees - Use two varieties from the same or similar flowering times.

Variety	Season
Hazen – Std	Early
Wealthy – Std	Early
Whitney – Std (Crabapple)	Early
Yellow Transparent – Std	Early
Norland – Std	Early
State Fair – Std & Semi-Dwf	Early
Centennial – Std (Crabapple)	Early to Mid
Chestnut – Std (Crabapple)	Early to Mid
Goodland – Std	Mid
Honeycrisp – Std	Mid
Honeygold – Std	Mid
McIntosh – Std & Semi-Dwf	Mid
Red Barron – Std	Mid
Sweet Sixteen – Std & Semi-Dwf	Mid
Haralred/Haralson – Std & Semi-Dwf	Late



Pollination of Cherries - Plant two varieties for Bing and Black Tartarian.

Evans Bali, Lapin, Mesabi, Meteor, Montmorency, North Star, Pinedale, and Sweethard are self-fruitful. They do not require pollinators.

Pollination of Plums - Use Toka and Compass as a pollinator. Mount Royal is self-fruitful.

Pollination of Apricots: - Use two varieties.

Pollination of Pears - Use two varieties, do not use Gourmet as a pollinator.
